Jerome David Kern (1885 – 1945) was one of the most important American theater composers of the early twentieth century. He wrote more than 700 songs, used in more than 100 stage works, of which only *Show Boat* is now regularly revived.

George Gershwin (1898 – 1937) was an American composer and pianist whose compositions spanned popular, jazz, and classical genres. Among his best-known works are the orchestral compositions "Rhapsody in Blue" and "An American in Paris," the jazz standards "Embraceable You" and "I Got Rhythm," the opera *Porgy and Bess*, and the musicals *Girl Crazy* and *Funny Face*.

Frederick Loewe (1901 – 1988) collaborated with lyricist Alan Jay Lerner on a series of Broadway including *Brigadoon*, *Paint Your Wagon*, *My Fair Lady*, and *Camelot*, all of which were made into films, as well as the original film musical *Gigi*, which was first transferred to the stage in 1973.

Richard Rodgers (1902 – 1979) worked primarily in musical theater. With 43 Broadway musicals and more than 900 songs to his credit, Rodgers was one of the best-known American composers of the twentieth century. With Lorenz Hart, he wrote *Pal Joey*, *A Connecticut Yankee*, *On Your Toes*, and *Babes in Arms*. With Oscar Hammerstein, he wrote *Oklahoma!*, *Flower Drum Song*, *Carousel*, *South Pacific*, *The King and I*, and *The Sound of Music*.

Jerrold Bock (1928 – 2010) received the Tony Award for Best Musical and the Pulitzer Prize for Drama with Sheldon Harnick for their 1959 musical *Fiorello!* and the Tony Award for Best Composer and Lyricist for the 1964 musical *Fiddler on the Roof* with Sheldon Harnick.

Leonard Bernstein (1918 – 1990) was an American conductor, composer, pianist, music educator, author, and humanitarian. As a composer, Bernstein wrote in many genres, including symphonic and orchestral music, ballet, film and theater music, choral works, opera, chamber music, and pieces for the piano. Bernstein's works include the Broadway musicals *West Side Story*, *On the Town*, *Wonderful Town*, *Candide*, and the original score for the Elia Kazan drama film *On the Waterfront*.

This concert is dedicated to the memory of **Sam Johnston** (1941 – 2025), euphonium player extraordinaire, who was a steady fixture in the Contra Costa Wind Symphony almost since its inception. Luis Zuñiga is a conductor, saxophonist, and educator. He attended the National Conservatory in his native Panama. After graduating from high school, Zuñiga received degrees in audio engineering, MIDI production, and performance from Shoreline Community College in Seattle. In addition, he completed his Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Miami, Florida; a Master of Musical Arts degree in saxophone performance at UCLA; and a master's degree in conducting from California State University, Los Angeles. In 2010, during his graduate research, Zuñiga was a member of the world-renowned saxophone class of Jean-Yves Fourmeau in Paris. In 2011 he received his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in saxophone performance and pedagogy from the University of Colorado, Boulder. Besides being a professional musician and educator, Zuñiga holds a college degree in automotive technology and enjoys car restoration and car racing.
